EXISTING FUND LINEUP CHANGES

After a recent review of the options offered through the plan, a decision was made to make the following change to the Pipefitters Local 636 Defined Contribution Fund's investment menu effective April 1, 2025:

- Replace Vanguard Institutional Index with Fidelity 500 Index
- Replace Vanguard Mid Cap Index with Fidelity Mid Cap Index
- Replace Diamond Hill Large Cap with Putnam Large Cap Value Y
- Replace Artisan Small Cap with Invesco Discovery Y

Why is this change taking place?

The Fund's Investment Consultant tracks and monitors the mutual funds available in the Plan with regards to risk, return, consistency and overall due diligence. When looking at the current funds available, the consultant recommended replacing the above listed funds:

What if I am currently invested in any of the above listed funds?

If you have made an election to invest into the Vanguard Institutional Index, Vanguard Mid Cap Index, Diamond Hill Large Cap or Artisan Small Cap, the existing balances of your account invested in the fund will be transferred to the as outlined below:

If you do not want your balance or future contributions transferred as outlined above, you must make your investment change(s) prior to 2:00 p.m. Eastern Time on March 28, 2025, as you will be unable to initiate fund transfers or make investment election changes from 2:00 p.m. Eastern Time on March 28, 2025, until 9 a.m. April 1, 2025. Full access to your account will be restored on April 1, including the ability to make fund transfers and investment election changes.

What is the objective of the Fidelity 500 Index?

The Fidelity 500 Index Fund is a diversified domestic large-cap equity strategy that seeks to closely track the returns and characteristics of the S&P 500 Index. The S&P 500 is a market-capitalization-weighted index designed to measure the performance of 500 large-cap U.S. companies. The fund holds each constituent security at approximately the same weight as the index.

What is the objective of the Fidelity Mid Cap Index?

The Fidelity Mid Cap Index Fund is a diversified domestic mid-cap equity strategy that seeks to closely track the returns and characteristics of the Russell Midcap Index. The Russell Midcap Index is a market-capitalization-weighted index designed to measure the performance of the 800 smallest companies in the Russell 1000 Index. The fund aims to hold each constituent security at approximately the same weight as the index.

What is the objective of the Putnam Large Cap Value Fund?

The Putnam Large Cap Value Fund seeks capital growth and current income by investing mainly in common stocks of U.S. companies, with a focus on value stocks that offer the potential for capital growth, current income, or both. The fund focuses on future cash flows and puts distinct emphasis on companies that can grow their dividends and are able and willing to return cash to shareholders. The fund benchmarks itself against the Russell 1000 Value Index.

What is the objective of the Invesco Discovery Fund?

The Invesco Discovery Fund seeks capital appreciation. The funds typically will invest in small-cap U.S. growth companies that they believe are industry leaders and pioneers with high-quality management teams. The fund benchmarks itself against the Russell 2000 Growth Index.

- Replace Loomis Sayles Core Plus Bond N with Loomis Sayles Core Plus Bond Y
- Replace American Century Small Cap Value Inv with American Century Small Cap Value R6

Why is this change taking place?

The Fund's Investment Consultant tracks and monitors the mutual funds available in the Plan with regards to overall cost structure within the funds. We were able to make various fund changes within the lineup to lower the Gross and/or Net expense ratio of the funds available. The portfolio managers, construction of portfolio or overall management of the funds will not change between the different share classes.

After a recent review of the options offered through the plan, a decision was made to make the following add the following funds to the Pipefitters Local 636 Defined Contribution Fund's investment menu effective April 1, 2025:

- Addition of Fidelity Small Cap Index
- Addition of Fidelity International Index
- Addition of T. Rowe Price Mid Cap Value
- Addition of Federated Hermes MDT Mid Cap Growth IS

What is the objective of the Fidelity Small Cap Index?

The Fidelity Small Cap Index Fund is a diversified domestic small-cap equity strategy that seeks to closely track the returns and characteristics of the Russell 2000 Index. The Russell 2000 Index is a market-capitalization-weighted index designed to measure the performance of the smallest 2000 companies in the Russell 3000 Index.

What is the objective of the Fidelity International Index?

The Fidelity International Index Fund is a diversified international equity strategy that seeks to closely track the returns and characteristics of the MSCI EAFE Index. The MSCI EAFE Index is a market-capitalization-weighted index that includes large/mid cap firms in 21 developed-markets countries, excluding the U.S. and Canada.

What is the objective of the T. Rowe Price Mid Cap Value Fund?

The T. Rowe Price Mid Cap Value Fund seeks to provide long-term capital appreciation by investing primarily in mid-sized companies that appear to be undervalued. The fund will normally invest at least 80% of its net assets in companies whose market capitalization falls within the range of companies in the S&P MidCap 400 Index or the Russell Midcap Value Index. The fund focuses on companies with attractive operating margins, sound balance sheet and financial manager, as well as stock ownership by management.

What is the objective of the Federated Hermes MDT Mid Cap Growth Fund?

The Federated Hermes MDT Mid Cap Growth Fund pursues capital appreciation and invests primarily in growth-oriented mid-cap U.S. companies. The fund selects stocks through a bottom up, quantitatively driven process. The fund also seeks to remove subjective and emotional influences from security selection and capitalize on market inefficiencies.

Investment Restrictions

In addition to any restrictions imposed by the plan, the following restrictions are imposed by the plan investment alternative.

American Century Small Cap R6

A round trip is defined as a buy and sell that occur within 7 days. Maximum of 1 round trip allowed per 1 year period. American Century Investments uses a variety of techniques to monitor for and detect frequent trading practices. These techniques may vary depending on the type of fund, the class of shares or whether the shares are held directly or indirectly with American Century Investments. They may change from time to time as determined by American Century Investments in its sole discretion. To minimize harm to the funds and their shareholders, we reserve the right to reject any purchase order (including exchanges) from any shareholder we believe has a history of frequent trading or whose trading, in our judgment, has been or may be disruptive to the funds. In making this judgment, we may consider trading done in multiple accounts under common ownership or control. Currently, for shares held directly with American Century Investments, we may deem the sale of all or a substantial portion of a shareholder's purchase of fund shares to be frequent trading if the sale is made: within seven days of the purchase, or within 30 days of the purchase, if it happens more than once per year. To the extent practicable, we try to use the same approach for defining frequent trading for shares held through financial intermediaries. American Century Investments reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to identify other trading practices as abusive and to modify its monitoring and other practices as necessary to deal with novel or unique abusive trading practices.

Diamond Hill Large Cap Fund A
